A. Discussion and possible decision for a new business sign with Neon Lettering and Neon; also a wall mounted protruding sign at 226 W. Route 66 "Cruise'n on Route 66": (Carl Johnson)

Carl Johnson was available and presented his request for a new business sign in neon lettering. Unfortunately, he has changed his design and did not update his application, the commissioners asked to table this particular item until a new application with the proper dimensions and number of lumens for the Neon are available. Mr. Johnson request for a wall mounted basic aluminum protruding sign using the existing brackets and mortar was motioned to be approved by Vice-Chair Besler and Commissioner McDowell seconded and it carried.

B. Discussion and possible decision for supporting HR801
Designation for Route 66 with a "Letter of Support" and a recommendation to support to Council. (David Zimmerman)

David Zimmerman presented his request for the Commissioners in supporting HR801 with a "Letter of Support" and a recommendation to council for their "Letter of Support" and Resolution. With this designation, Route 66 will join other celebrated long distance travel route such as the Santa Fe Trail, the Lewis & Clark trail and the Selma to Montgomery Trail. While all eight Route 66 states already have at least two National Historic Trails, Route 66 will be the first National Historic Trail to celebrate motorized travel and America's love of the automobile. Designating Route 66 as a National Historic Trail will help preserve and revive one of America's most iconic routes, helping to support local economies in the hundreds of small towns Route 66 passes through from Chicago to Los Angeles. Vice-Chair Besler motioned to support HR801 with a Letter of Support

and a recommendation to council to support with "Letter of Support" and Resolution. Commissioner Dunn seconded and it carried.

Mike Besler recused himself from the Commission to address them with agenda items

C. Discussion and possible decision on replace 3 existing windows with Single hung metal windows and add 4x4 angle from above both shed doors. Replace north shed door with steel door painted brown at 217 W. Route 66 "Colors of the West"; (Mike Besler)

Mike Besler presented his request to replace 3 existing windows with single hung metal windows. He will replace the bars currently on the window once new windows are installed. Used bricks from other projects used to complete the arch look that was original to building. 4x4 anchor bolts used for support to window arch. Mike Besler requested the removal of all existing window jams and replaced, all jams completely rotted and termite infested. Mike has the termite problems fixed and would like to replace windows and jams to complete the renovation along with adding two additional window with frosted glass above door.
