## Lighting

Use bulbs with a high lumen rating and low wattage, especially in halls and closets.

Use translucent lamp shades which give off more light.

Keep light fixtures and bulbs clean. Turn off all lights when you are not using them.

Install a low voltage lighting system outdoors. Put it on a timer to turn it on and off automatically.

Use decorative lighting only when needed.


Use florescent bulbs in kitchen and baths.

Use long life light bulbs in hard to reach places only. They are less efficient than ordinary bulbs.

When redecorating, consider light colored interior decor to increase efficiency of the lighting system

**Invest in a timer.** Timers that automatically turn lights on and off can reduce your energy use and at the same time increase safety by making a house seem occupied even when people are away.

**Don't skimp on bulbs.** Consider the cost of lighting your home. Do you realize that the money you spend on light bulbs is probably only 5-10 percent of the total cost? The other 90-95 percent is the cost of electricity to run those bulbs. That's why you should look for more efficient rather than cheaper light bulbs, and why compact fluorescent lights are so appealing.

**More bulbs are not better.** Use one bulb instead of multiple bulbs whenever possible. A single 100-watt incandescent bulb produces the same amount of light as two 60-watt bulbs, and it uses 20 percent less energy.



### **Call and ask about Equalizer Budgeting Plan**

The Equalizer Program lets the customer pay about the same amount on their electric bill each month...summer or winter. The Equalizer Payment Amount (EPA) is based on the average of the past 12 electric bills, plus or minus any amortized amount.
